STATISTICAL PROBLEMS OF UNDER-DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

September 28, 1953

The first fall meeting will be devoted to a discussion of the statistical problems of the so-called under-developed countries. The economic development programs of these countries require the marshalling of a vast variety of statistical data concerning the human and economic resources to be developed. Unfortunately, in under-developed countries, statistics are under-developed also. As a result, these countries find themselves considerably handicapped in evaluating their economic and social problems.
